

SCHEDULE A: CONDITIONS OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY USE

CONDITIONS OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY USE

The following conditions govern the use of the University's Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Facilities, Services and Materials:

1. ICT Facilities, Services and Materials must not be used:
 - for unlawful activities
 - for commercial purposes other than those under the auspices of the University
 - for personal financial gain
 - in ways that cause interference with others' use of ICT Facilities, Services and Materials, including by online gaming or undertaking political activity
 - in ways that breach legislation or the policies of the University
 - in ways that constitute an infringement of copyright or a licence agreement, including but not limited to downloading, transmitting and storing of copyrighted entertainment materials.
2. ICT Users may not:
 - divulge their passwords, except where required by Deakin eSolutions staff for IT support purposes
 - use another ICT User's password
 - falsify their identities, forge any communication or send communications under a false identity
 - knowingly display, store or distribute electronic material that may have the effect of causing harassment to any person including attacking, harassing or threatening to attack or harass, or intimidating any person
 - knowingly distribute electronic material that is offensive, sexually explicit, or racially, religiously or sexually intolerant
 - knowingly display or store electronic material that is offensive, sexually explicit, or racially, religiously or sexually intolerant unless prior approval has been granted for the purpose of research or study
 - knowingly introduce or disseminate programs or data intended to damage ICT facilities or services (this includes but is not limited to computer spyware, viruses, Trojan horses or worms)
 - circumvent or subvert system security measures
3. ICT Users must:
 - refrain from any noisy or unseemly behaviour or other conduct likely to interfere with the comfort or convenience of other persons within the ICT Facility, or likely to damage or result in the unauthorised use of ICT Facilities, Services or Materials or other property of or in the care of the University
 - refrain from eating or drinking in any ICT Facility
 - ensure that conversation and use of mobile phones does not interfere with the comfort or convenience of other persons within the ICT Facility
 - not reserve workstations in laboratories. Any ICT Users absent for more than 15 minutes from the workstations they have been using forfeit their rights to those places. They may be logged off and the places taken by other ICT Users
 - not alter the arrangement of furniture and fittings or misuse them in any way
 - place litter in the bins provided.
4. ICT Facilities, Services and Materials may be used for incidental personal use provided such use does not:
 - interfere with the operation of any ICT Facilities or impact negatively on other ICT Users
 - burden the University with unreasonable additional costs
 - interfere with the ICT User's employment or other obligations to the University.
